Bonded labour affects between 15 and 20 million labourers within the region, and is shaped by locally specific interconnections between ethnicity, class, caste and, critically, gender structures. *Masculinity and Modern Slavery in Nepal* explores the role of masculinity in shaping the structures and experience of slavery and subsequent freedom.
