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Standard Guidelines How To Draw

Guidelines are like cheat sheets. Try it this way with guides: Use a ruler and put a (very slight!) horizontal line of 6 cm (or 6 inches). Put a dash at 3 cm (or 3 inches) and draw a vertical line with 3 cm (or 3 inches) above and below the horizontal. Now you just have the outermost points of your lines to draw a small bulge.

As their place, we draw them right above the eyes, the line resting there is our guideline. They can go a bit further than the eyes, but the starting point is the same. Setting up guidelines. Guidelines are lines that can be placed anywhere in the drawing window to aid in object placement. In some applications, guidelines are known as guides. There are three types of guidelines: horizontal, vertical, and angled. By default, the application displays guidelines that you add to the drawing window, but you can hide them at any time.

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Use a ruler to draw three sets of evenly-spaced guidelines, and make sure that you maintain a consistent distance between each set. There is about 1/4" (6.35 mm) of space between these three groups of calligraphy guidelines. A rolling ruler makes it easier to create parallel guidelines.

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Draw pins according to function Show pins of ICs in a position relevant to their function, NOT HOW THEY HAPPEN TO STICK OUT OF THE CHIP. Try to put positive power pins at the top, negative power pins (usually grounds) at the bottom, inputs at left, and outputs at right. Note that this fits with the general schematic layout as described above.
